

Hertelendy György was a county judge in Zala, Hungary, born in 1721 and died in Vindornyalak on July 1, 1780. He inherited a significant fortune from his ancestors, which he greatly expanded by acquiring lands in ten villages and owning properties in fourteen other locations. In 1755, he opposed the attempt of Sántói residents to seize vindornyalaki farmland. In 1756, he purchased the properties of Köveskál, Szepezd, Sóstó, and Sásd from the Nemes family for 800 forints. He bought land in Vindornyalak, Fok, Keresztúr, and Karmacs from Csiszár Imre and Varga Julianna in May 1759, and acquired Csiszár István's property in the same four villages on May 22, 1759.

In October 1771, he received the inheritance of Szakonyi György's property in Köveskút, and on October 21, 1771, Szakonyi Anna transferred her land in Köveskút to Hertelendy György. However, on December 13 of the same year, Demeteri Sándor and Köveskúti Zsuzsanna objected to this transfer.

In May 1773, he acquired the manor and associated lands of Katona György in Kis-Béke, Karmacson, and increased his wealth. On June 8, 1773, he bought Horváth Mózes's land in Felső-Kusta. On November 20, 1773, he acquired Simon Márton's property in Kis-Karmacs, Vindornyafoke, Keresztúr, and Köveskút.

On December 1, 1774, he purchased Szakonyi István's property in Fok and Karmacs. In 1776, he divided the Kusta land with his brother. In addition to these properties, he owned houses, taverns, water, and dry mills in Karmacson, Fok, Mihályfa, and Tördemicze.

He was not only a wealth acquirer but also a devout Catholic, as he was a member of the "Mária Szíve" Society in Pozsony in 1762. He served as a county judge in Zala in 1756-1757 and 1762. On September 18, 1757, he participated in the restoration of the authentic location of Zalavár on behalf of the county.
